Home exam essays

Use relevant contributions on your reading list to answer *one* of the following two questions:

(1) Describe the ticking bomb scenario (TBS) and how it has been used in public debates about torture. Discuss the possible relevance of TBS for interrogational practices in the ongoing fight against terrorism

or

(2) Describe and discuss representations of torture in popular culture

Formal requirements

Size: max 2400 words (roughly 6 pages), front page, contents page (if used) and bibliography are *not* included (but words in footnotes at the bottom of each page in the text are, if used, counted)

Language: English, Norwegian (or Danish, Swedish)

Font: 12

Spacing: 1 ½

Left margin: 1.25" (3 cm), right margin is optional

Citation: shorter extracts (1 – 2 lines) from books or articles should be part of the text, like this: "CIA interrogators made their victims assume "stress positions" without any external mechanism" (McCoy 2006: 59, citation marks in original). Longer quotations must be separated by indentation (no need to use citation marks), spacing 1, like this:

CIA interrogators made their victims assume “stress positions” without any external mechanism. Similarly, both the Paris Inquisition’s “water question” and the CIA’s “water boarding” forced fluids down the victim’s throat to simulate a sense of drowning (McCoy 2006: 59, citation marks in original).

Bibliography: the bibliography at the end of the essay should only include works referred to or cited in the text, and be set up in alphabetical order like this:

Luban, David (2005). “Liberalism, Torture, and the Ticking Bomb”, in *Virginia Law Review*, vol. 91, issue 6

McCoy, Alfred (2006). *A Question of Torture*. New York: Metropolitan Books

Any exam at the University of Oslo will be checked for both correct word count and incidents of cheating. The text recognition software Ephorus will be used to find cases of plagiarism. Failure to cite sources or highlight quotes in any assignments that are handed in is considered cheating.
