- 4. What are the limitations in previous approaches to literacies for understanding today are social practices?
- 5. In which ways do Gillen use methods and create evidence for her argumentation?

Issues to be raised in relation to Littleton, K. & Mercer, N. Interthinking: putting talk to work.

- 1. What's the dominant perspective used in Littleton and Mercers (L&M) book?
- 2. What are the main concepts used to constitute their position?
- 3. What's the relationship between talk and learning when interthinking is one core concept?
- 4. In which ways do L&M use methods and create evidence for their argumentation?
- 5. Is there any limitation in the perspective used to explain learning?
- 6. Which function does tools and artefacts have for developing students talk?
