CUSU is committed to ensuring that Circle U. becomes an accessible, inclusive, and universal European University that provides equal educational opportunities for all students.






The Fellow Programme


- CUSU have been working to achieve Student Fellow positions!

Accessible, relevant and recognisable offers

 - Continuous dialogue, not only when it's convenient
