- Please look at the <u>program structure</u> and course sites when registering for courses. Note that ILOS courses will have on-campus teaching, 60% obligatory attendance, and obligatory activities (assignments, essays, oral presentations, etc.)

Elective courses

- Your electives must include at least one course in language history and one course in modern language.
 - exception: if you have passed a course in language history or modern language at bachelor's level, you do not need to take one as part of your master's.
- Elective courses (1) You choose two to four courses (20–40 credits)
- * the department does not offer every course each semester.
- Elective courses (2) You may select up to two courses (20 credits)
- *includes courses where bachelor and master students are taught together as well as courses from other departments.
- *Non-linguistics courses such as civilization/literature from English-speaking areas can also be chosen if they are relevant to the master's thesis.

Obligatory attendance

- All courses at ILOS will have a minimum requirement of 60% attendance starting this semester
- The 40% allowed absence is meant to cover illness, travel, work, and other reasons, and you will not get a valid absence based on documentation
- •What the requirement means specifically in each course is listed under «Teaching» on the individual course pages
- •Example: ENG4111- In this course you have to attend 5 of 9 seminars.

Absences from obligatory activities such as assignments, essays, oral presentations and exams

- •If you are ill and need a **postponed submission deadline on your assignment**, you must <u>apply for it</u>

- •If you are ill at the time of the exam or have another valid reason for not taking an **exam**, your absence can be approved.
 - *On this <u>website</u> you will find information about what to do in case of absence from exams

September 1st

- Semester registration
- Paying the semester fee
- Signing up for courses, including exams (actual deadline)
- Applying for leave, part time or delay of studies

Part-time studies, leave of absence

- You can apply for part-time studies and leave of absence
- Deadlines for applications: September 1st (fall semester) and February 1st (spring semester)
- You will find information and the application forms <u>here</u>
- Absences or delays that are not pre-approved could in some cases lead to you losing your spot in the program
- If you get delayed with your thesis in your fourth (last) semester, you can apply for a 5th semester


Have you heard of the new app?
