

FIL2310 Assessment Criteria ('sensorveiledning')

The course examination consists of a portfolio ('mappe') containing one 1500-word and 4000-word essay.

The essays will be jointly evaluated on the basis of:

Content:

- **Understanding:** The author shows that they correctly understand the main theoretical positions of the discussed literature through their accurate representation.
- **Argumentation:** The author shows the ability to carefully explain philosophical arguments.
- **Analysis:** The author shows the ability to engage in nuanced philosophical analysis of the literature, including relating different views and drawing out philosophical insights.
- **Contribution:** The author shows the ability to undertake their own, original contribution to the discussed literature.

Writing:

- **Primary literature:** The author uses the mandatory literature.
- **Secondary literature:** The author shows the ability to seek out and use relevant secondary literature.
- **Structure:** The author shows the ability to organise their writing in a manner that contributes to readers' ease of following the main content.
- **Language:** The author shows the ability to write in a comprehensible manner, correctly use and explain technical terminology, and use correct grammar and spelling.
- **Referencing:** The author shows the ability to appropriately and consistently follow international academic standards for referencing citations and quotations, including a bibliography (APA 6th, Chicago 16th, or Harvard).
