

## **KUN 4010 phase II fall semester 2016**

### **Period of teaching: week 40–48**

In phase I, the entire group of new MA students are given a common introduction to the study, including visits to relevant archives and libraries. In the second half of the semester (phase II), the students will be divided into groups depending on their lines of interest, and the responsibility for teaching will be distributed among the relevant teachers. Normally, the teacher of each group will continue as supervisor once the project plan is accepted.

The students will deliver a preliminary outline for their project Monday Sep. 26 at the latest, whereafter the seminar groups will be set up.

The teacher will advise the students about their project, individually and in seminars. It is recommended that the teacher and the students put together a reading list, c. 750 pp.:

- Theory and methodology relevant to the fields that the students are interested in – common for the entire seminar, c. 250 pp.
- An individual reading list for each student with titles relevant for the project, c. 500 pp.

The teacher has an individual meeting with each student about the project and the literature. If needed, a second meeting can be scheduled.

The teacher summons the students to two seminars:

- The proposed theme for the first seminar is theory and methodology based on the common reading list. The students are expected to have read in advance.
- At the second seminar, the students present their project plans. They will distribute drafts for their project descriptions beforehand to the other members of the group, and will be asked by the teacher to prepare comments to each others presentations.

Obligatory activities for the students:

- attend individual supervision
- attend two seminars
- deliver a draft for the project plan, c. 4–5 pp. plus bibliography.
- comment on the project plan of a fellow student

### **Definitive project plan: deadline and assessment**

Deadline for handing in the definitive project plan: Monday Dec. 5.

Grading: Accepted/not accepted, to be decided by the teacher and me (LL)

Deadline for grading: Wednesday Dec. 15.

If the project plan is not accepted, the student will have the possibility to deliver a new plan in the course of the spring semester, providing that he/she has fulfilled the requirements regarding obligatory activities (cf. above). No teaching is offered in the spring semester, but the student will be offered one or two individual meetings with the teacher, depending on how much revision that needs to be carried out.
