Choose **one** of the following topics

1. In the later Middle Ages, the emergence of various devotional practices based on seeing implied a shift in attitudes towards vision, deviating from the three-level hierarchy established by St. Augustine. Compare the ideals of the Augustinian paradigm to the late medieval implementation of seeing in a devotional context, and discuss the consequences of this shift. Exemplify with concrete examples of images and/or objects used for devotional purposes, from the curriculum.

Use as heading: Ideals of vision and seeing

2. In her essay "Seeing and seeing beyond: The Mass of St. Gregory in the fifteenth century", Caroline Walker Bynum states that "the religious experience it [the Gregorymass] 'constitutes' is one in which 'seeing' is 'seeing through'" (p. 215–216). Give an outline of her reasoning, and explain why a rendering of the Gregorymass, according to Bynum, is *not* a representation of the transubstatiation. The theological thinking regarding matter and change lies at the basis of her argument: explain how.

Use as heading: The Gregorymass according to Caroline Bynum

3. Several of the authors on the reading list anchor their analyses of images and objects in the "visual culture" of the later Middle Ages. Give a brief outline of what visual culture is according to Janet Kromm, Nicholas Mirzoeff, W.J.T. Mitchell, and/or Irit Rogoff – you can make a selection if you prefer. Discuss the applicability of the concept for the study of medieval imagery. What can a visual culture approach contribute that cannot be achieved by standard art historical methods? Try out your reasoning by applying it on a concrete case: an image, or an object, from the curriculum.
