Write an essay on *ONE* (only one) of the following topics:

- 1. Discuss the role of satire in Enlightenment literature, with reference to one or more texts from the module.
- Give an interpretation of the extract from Alexander Pope's *The Rape of the Lock* (See Text A), considering its relation to the poem as a whole and discussing any themes that you consider significant. You might wish to explore the poem's literary form, satiric strategies or relation to the social and economic context of the period.
- 3. The theorist Raymond Williams writes that 'a contrast between country and city, as fundamental ways of life, reaches back into classical times'. In what ways are urban and rural life represented in Enlightenment literature? What is the significance of this opposition? Consider with reference to at least two texts from the course.
- 4. Give an interpretation of Thomas Gray's *Elegy Written in a Country Churchyard*, considering the literary strategies that it deploys and exploring the significance of its argument. (See Text B).
