KRIM2957 Surveillance: Data, technologies, practices

Date of exam: 28 November at 13:00 to 3 Desember at 13:00

Discuss one of the following questions:

How does the surveillance of digital data relate to processes of social sorting? Give examples from different thematic fields in surveillance studies and relevant literature.

or

How can dataveillance be questioned, controlled or limited? You can either discuss everyday strategies applied by Internet users or the role of rights and legal principles in that context.

The question can be answered in English, Norwegian, Danish or Swedish.

Size: Maximum 2400 words (roughly 6pages). Front page, contents page (optional) and bibliography are not included. If footnotes are used in the text (at the bottom of each page), they are included in the 2400 word limit. **Papers that exceed the 2400 word limit will be disallowed.**

Cheating: Any exam at the University of Oslo is being checked for both correct word count and incidents of cheating. Text recognition software will be used to find cases of plagiarism. Failure to cite sources or highlight quotes in any assignments that are handed in is considered cheating. You must cite the source if you obtain data, reasoning and arguments from the literature, syllabus, lecture notes, web pages, other students' papers or your own previously submitted papers. Short or long pieces of text quoted verbatim from other sources must be italicised so that it is obvious that it is a quote.

Submit your exam: The essays shall be handed in electronically in Inspera. Exams at the University of Oslo are anonymous. Instead of your name, write your candidate number found in StudentWeb.
