Choose <u>one</u> of the following two topics:

## (1) Drug scares and moral panics:

Read Liviu Alexandrescu's article "Mephedrone, assassin of youth: The rhetoric of fear in contemporary drug scares". Summarize Alexandrescu's main argument, and use relevant texts on the required reading list to discuss his use of the 'moral panic' paradigm.

or

## (2) Popular culture representations of crime:

Read Tiffany Bergin's article "Identity and nostalgia in a globalised world". Summarize Bergin's main argument, and use relevant texts on the required reading list to discuss her analysis of the television series *Midsomer Murders*.

**Size:** Maximum 2400 words (roughly 6 pages). Front page, contents page (optional) and bibliography are not included. If footnotes are used in the text (at the bottom of each page), they are included in the 2400 word limit.

**Cheating:** Any exam at the University of Oslo is being checked for both correct word count and incidents of cheating. The text recognition software Ephorus will be used to find cases of plagiarism. Failure to cite sources or highlight quotes in any assignments that are handed in is considered cheating.

**Submit your exam:** The essays shall be handed in at the Information Centre at the Faculty of Law in Domus Academica, Karl Johansgate 47. Bring two copies of your essay, remember to also bring your student card or some other kind of ID. The paper shall also be submitted in Fronter. Exams at the University of Oslo are anonymous. Instead of your name, write your four-digit candidate number found in StudentWeb.
