

IMPORTANT CHECKLIST CONCERNING THE 4- HOUR WRITTEN EXAM

- You will find the different locations for the exams on the course web page. (visible approx. 2 weeks before the exam takes place) e.g.

- Remember to withdraw from the exams you will not take on the Student web. (you will find the closing date linked from “time and place for the examinations”)
- Remember to bring along a valid proof of identity on the day of examination.
- You must be present no later than 90 minutes before the exam starts- which is **08.30**- because of the book-check. (The exam starts at 10.00) NB! You are responsible to bring along only the auxiliary allowed in each course + the material covered by the general rules. If you make illegal marks in the auxiliary material, or bring illegal books/material into the examination room, this could lead to an annulment of your exam or an exclusion from the University up to one year. (According to the Directive for Evaluation of Cheating)
- Please read the rules regarding the auxiliary material and references very carefully. Do not make marks in auxiliary materials if you are unsure whether or not they are permitted. Please see the following link: <http://www.jus.uio.no/studier/regelverk/auxiliary-materials.html>
- Please note that there might be changes concerning the auxiliary material, remember therefore to check each course’s website regularly for further information. Students who are registered for exams taught in Norwegian (e.g. Nord- Plus students) must also check the list for exams taught in Norwegian- as there are some important differences: <http://www.jus.uio.no/studier/regelverk/hjelpemidler-eksamen.html>
- You will find the list of auxiliary materials linked from each course page (where you find the course description) under exam resources.
- Printouts from computer database/internet are not permitted. Copies of allowed materials must indicate that they are taken from a public document.
- Read carefully “Auxiliary materials” allowed for the different exams.
- Read carefully the “Guidance for examination candidates” (enclosed)
- Read carefully “ **HOW TO WRITE EXAMINATION PAPERS IN LAW** ”(enclosed)
- Remember that the left part of the examination sheet is reserved for the censors to make comments on.
- You may also bring a dictionary which does not give legal definitions. The dictionary should just exemplify the word and not give further information. Dictionaries with encyclopedia definitions are not allowed.
- Remember to bring along a **watch**. (cell phones/mobiles should be switched off and be out of reach of the candidate.)
