

About the course:

The course provides an essential understanding of the legal framework that governs international business transactions and the limits of the parties' autonomy. It challenges a common misunderstanding on self-sufficiency of international contracts.

The course gives the tools to properly appreciate how far the drafting of an international contract may go, as well as to evaluate whether a claim based on an international contract is likely to be enforceable according to its terms or not.

The course covers the most critical topics for understanding international business transactions, including contractual drafting practice, the role of governing law, the impact of the choice of law, the limits of transnational law and arbitration.
