### JUS5670 – Electronic Commerce Law

The language of examination for this course is English: students may answer in English ONLY, answers in any other language than English will be given a F (F for fail).

Read the following carefully and answer all the questions below:

“The internet must not become a jungle where consumers fear to tread. But we also don’t want it to become a desert where innovation is stifled by too many rules.” (Speech by Viviane Reding, Vice-President European Commission, at the Second Consumer Rights Forum in June 2010.)

In light of the above ambitions, to what extent, if any, does the new Consumer Rights Directive (2011/83/EU) provide better rules for both consumers and traders than the soon-to-be-repealed Distance Selling Directive (97/7/EC) with regards to:

- (1) the right of withdrawal from online contracts, including the responsibility for payment of costs related thereto and the diminished value of the goods;
- (2) online contracts for the supply of digital content and the right of withdrawal therefrom;
- (3) the manner in which the terms and conditions of an online contract are to be provided to the consumer;
- (4) pre-ticked boxes in order forms. (Note: Short answer to question 4 is sufficient).
