

Methods of Learning and Teaching

Case Meeting: Written patient record

Complete a patient record (two students per patient)

Present it for the rest of your colleagues as a PowerPoint presentation:

- Short resume about the patient
- The disease itself

Max 15 min per group, followed by a 5 min discussion

All students must complete 4 medical records; 3 submitted for correction and feedback and 1 presented in the Case Meeting

Norwegian/Danish students write the records in Norwegian/Danish, all others write in English

Clinical small groups

The clinical small group teaching in Paediatrics and Obstetrics/Gyneecology will mainly take place at Ullevål, Rikshospitalet and Ahus. All students will have clinical rotations in all 3 hospitals.

Obstetrics and Gynaecology

A total of 15 clinical small groups in obstetrics and gynaecology is given during this module: 5 times at the Labor Ward, 3 times at the Gynaecology Outpatient Clinic, 3 times at the Gynaecology Ward, 1 time at the Gynaecology Outpatient Clinic Infertility, 2 times at the Antenatal Outpatient Clinic and 1 time at DNR (cancer).

Specification of requirements: During the time in the Labor Ward the student must assist during 3 deliveries (assess cervical dilatation and assist delivering the baby) and observe 1 caesarean section.

Paediatrics

A total of 10 clinical small groups in paediatrics is given during this module: 6 times at the Paediatric Ward, 3 times at the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit and 1 time at the Voksentoppen Center for Asthma and Allergy. The maximum absence from mandatory small group teaching is 3 times.

Courses and Group assignment

There are 2 courses in obstetrics and gynaecology: Introduction course and Summary course.

There are 4 courses in paediatrics: Introduction to Paediatrics, Inhalation therapy, HLR-course and Communication (the Communication course is held in cooperation with behavioral sciences).

Presentation of group assignment in Global Health. Students will be divided into groups and assigned a topic. The group must give a presentation on the given topic for the other students.

Plenary Instruction

Plenary instruction will be in the form of lectures and weekly seminars in the Auditorium at Rikshospitalet. The seminars will function as an introduction to various subjects, each session being half or a whole day in duration. Various methods of instruction and ways of engaging the students will be used. The lectures will relate to the different learning goals of the semester, mostly covering themes which are not addressed in the seminars.

Semesterweek 7 and 12 will focus entirely on theory, without any clinical small group teaching
