

i Information about the exam

Assignment requirements:

- The exam paper must be minimum 2 900 words and maximum 4 400 words including cover page and foot- or endnotes. Reference list is not to be included in the total number of words.
- Exam papers which do not meet the requirement for the minimum number of words or which exceed the maximum number of words will not be graded.
- Times New Roman, font size 12, line spacing 1,5
- Have numbered pages.
- Have a cover page which specifies:
 - Total number of words
 - The course code and title
 - Which question you have chosen to answer
 - Semester and year
 - Your candidate number. **Do not write your name in your exam paper.** You will find your candidate number in studentweb
- You may write your examination paper in Norwegian, Swedish, Danish or English.
- Make sure your submission is anonymous - do not use your name in your assignment or in the file name.
- You are only allowed to submit one file and it needs to be in **PDF-format**.

1 Exam

Answer **one (1)** of the following three questions:

1. Several of the course readings argue that we can learn about large scale, long term, and long-distance processes by looking at small and local phenomena like a family, one woman's life, or one person's body. Discuss the complex relations between such local and global processes as they relate to environmental issues. Use at least three examples from the reading list.
2. Davis and Todd argue that one of the main logics of the Anthropocene is "a severing of relations." What do they mean by this? Draw on at least three readings from the reading list and discuss how this statement can help us understand contemporary human-environment relations.
3. Discuss different approaches to how anthropologists can study non-human others. Select at least three readings from the reading list and discuss similarities and differences.
